Alt-RCM- Greetings Area: Open Forum topics at the November IRSC meetings follow: The IRCNA Subcommittee came to the Open Forum for guidance about submitting a \$500 financial request for protecting the Infinity Plaque and the IRCNA banners. For those who aren't familiar with what I am talking about, each Iowa Regional Convention has had a banner, and each of these banners has been

saved to display at each new convention. In order to preserve and protect the banners some type of container is necessary for them to be stored in from year to year. 7 of the banners apparently don't have containers and the current IRCNA subcommittee has been entrusted with the responsibility of coming up with them. There is also, an Infinity Banner that is displayed with the names and date of passing of those in the Iowa Region who have died clean. Each year, names and date of death are added to this banner at the convention. At IRCNA, two years ago some newcomers apparently thought that the Infinity banner was the same type of thing that is at other conventions and put their name and clean dates on it. This made it necessary to remove these names from the banner, and started a discussion about a more permanent way to display the names and dates of passing. The Infinity Plaque was decided on. Now there is a concern about the fact that we have nothing to store this large plaque in. There was much discussion about the fact that \$300 of the proposed \$500 financial request was for a Plexiglas case for the Infinity plaque that would serve as storage and display case. Most of the people there thought this was a bit much and thought maybe a box might do as well. One of the members volunteered their time and materials to make a box for the plaque. Next on the list of topics: was the resignation of the RDA. Since the person representing our region at the WSC in an important position requiring travel and experience in the workings of service at the world level the RDA position is a two year commitment of serving with the current regional delegate gaining this experience. The current RD stated that he would be willing if asked to serve another two years term as RD to help season the RDA elect concerning the ins and out of WSC and Zonal Service. The ideas that were discussed were that there several members of IRSC who already had experience at the WSC and would be capable of serving in that capacity and that we should rotate the RD out of that position. These two alternatives were discussed and motions were drawn up to come before the IRSC meeting. The next item was the idea of raising the start up amount for IRCNA from \$1500 to \$2000. This would amount to a change in IRSC policy. Reasons for the increase were the difficulty in meeting hotel and merchandise costs. There was some discussion on ways to save on these expenses and a motion was drawn to come before the IRSC meeting. Many thanks for the opportunity to serve this area as RCM Alt for the past year, and I am blessed to have the opportunity to represent this Area next year. Next IRSC meeting will be held right here in racy, exotic, Des Moines, Iowa on February 19, 2005. Flyers are available out on the table. Hope to see you all there! ILS Jay F.

Ad-Hoc Budget Meeting 2004- Budget Ad-Hoc meeting was held at the ASO on November 14th, 2004. Those in attendance were Lia B. (PI Chair) Wayne R. (H & I Chair) Jack H. (Literature Chair) Robby E. Area Vice-Chair) Debi D. (Area Treasurer), Al, Jonna, and a few other visitors. The treasurer of area proposed that we get away from the yearly budget and have a monthly budget that would better suit our area. After some discussion all agreed that a monthly budget is acceptable and the following was decided. Monthly 2005 budget: Area - \$400, PI - \$170, H & I - \$180, Literature - \$23.75, Activities - \$400. Activities also, requested that a deposit account be set aside and used as a revolving deposit account in the amount of \$250.00. This was requested so that the funds will always be available for deposits on facilities for functions. This money would be returned to this account after each function (providing that the facilities do not deduct any fees for damages.)
