OFFICER'S REPORTS:

Chair-I would like to welcome everyone to our regularly scheduled September ASC. We have several items of business to get finished from July ASC. Including Ad-Hoc reports from several committees. Under new business we open area nominations, they close next month and voting is in November. Nominations can be made by an ASC officer and seconded by a GSR. Clean time requirements are Vice-Chair 2-years, Secretary – 1 year, Treasurer and RCM alt is 2 years, also setting a date for policy review. Since August Region I have been contacted by several NA members, area and regional about the content of our RCM's report to region. Their main concerns were that it contained several inaccuracies and was inappropriately timed. I asked at least one area officer to address this in their report. Treasurer- Opening Balance: **\$2260.76** Due to Area not meeting in August there was no regional donation made we will take care of it in November. I usually do not have much of a report for area but today I would like to take a few moments of your time so please bear with me. At area in July the issue came up regarding our RCM and his conduct at Regional meetings. The GSR's overwhelmingly voted to keep him in his current position, which as a member of this area I respected. Our RCM attended the August Region and gave his report, which to my disappointment was a slap in the face to the GSR's who voted to keep him in his position. There are a few areas of that report that I as an officer of this area would like to address. One of the issues that were stated was that our office has been having difficulties paying its bills, if this is true then why did they reduce our rent from \$150.00 to \$50.00 monthly a few months ago? It is my understanding that part of our area responsibility was to help maintain the office and when needed help in all ways possible as we do with all sub-committee. Yet I have heard nothing from the ASO director stating that they are having any financial problems. The report went on to further attack virtually all the sub-committees including the IRCNA Ad-Hoc by stating we are "who knows where". The members of IRCNA Ad-Hoc presented a report at the July area clearly stating what we were doing, when and where we would meet again and encouraged all who cared to please attend. It was also stated in this report that our areas complacency has reached a point where they did not meet last month. According to policy page 23 states "ASO is responsible for providing meeting space for AREA" If my memory serves me correctly it was a member of the ASO that brought the motion to move area in August to the 2nd week so as to even out the weeks. It was also their responsibility to make sure we had a place to meet. It went to also state that we "have so set date to meet in September". Page 6

of our Policy #2 states that's September area moves to the "second Sunday of the month". The report given in this nature thanked all of the GSR's of SCANA for supporting him in his position as our RCM. Alt-RCM- Greetings Area! Re: Open Forum-August Region – Dubuque Cedar Rapids, the Area that will be hosting IRCNA, brought to the open forum the issue of better containers for the IRCNA banners and the Eternity Plaque. Some of the banners containers are too small and some banners don't have containers, and a couple of banners seem to be missing. Several options were discussed: 1. Standardize the banner size and material going forward. 2. Use the profit from the last IRCNA to finance adequate covers. 3. Make a financial request to region for the funds to take care of this. 4. Destroy the banners, stop keeping NA property, and bring IRCNA into today. The IRCNA committee will take the information gained from the discussion and take care of the banners. Iowa City had a concern about people from outside their area coming to an open meeting held in a treatment center and voting in their business meeting to change standard policy. This concern stemmed from a long-standing policy of having open discussion meeting, which is something that the treatment center wanted, and the members who came in wanted to change the format to a speaker meeting. Points that came out of the discussion were: 1. Group conscience is the conscience of the people who attend the meeting. 2. Since the meeting is self supporting, all the meeting does is rent the space from the facility – we are not affiliated, and are not bound by what they want. 3. It is not going to be possible to determine who gets to attend a meeting and who doesn't. The ad-hoc Regional Committee came to the open forum to get input from the region concerning the project that they are working on to update Regional policy. There was discussion about changing clean time requirements in a couple of areas from 2-4 years. There was a discussion about the possibilities of the RD and RDA and whether or not they should be responsible to attend the Zonal Forums, or if there should be separate position created for this responsibility, and change from doing two treasurers reports (one for the fiscal year and one for the end of term) and just doing one. The clean and free will host Region on November 13th at the Waterloo Center for the Arts building. Flyers are available. Hope to see you there.
